As the leaves begin to turn and we move into autumn, our clinics are full of laughter, learning, and progress. We're so proud of the children we work with and the families who support them every step of the way.




Back to School!

Celebrating Inclusion : Our Amazing Work Experience Student




We are absolutely delighted to welcome an incredible young lady to the Happy Chatters team this term.

When he first started with us in May, he had just a few spoken words, and many were not clearly audible. Through weekly sessions at our Iver clinic, and more recently in his nursery setting, we have seen remarkable progress in both his language and engagement.

His special interest is Peppa Pig, and many of his early phrases were scripted from the show. By following his lead and using his scripts as a bridge for interaction, we've been able to model and expand on his natural language.

Now, he happily plays with his siblings, enjoys interactive games like catching and throwing a ball, and shows a wonderful imagination with toys.

Each week brings more spontaneous language ,commenting naturally on things he sees and experiences, such as "It's a slide!" or "Let's catch the ball!"

Hearing this growth has been so rewarding for our team. It's a joy to witness how connection, consistency, and the GLP approach can bring real communication to life.
